Job Title: Faith Engagement Manager

Position Summary:

The Faith Engagement Manager will be responsible for managing the Faith-in-Action program to maintain and grow participation from local faith partners and others in support of Habitat's mission. This position will be responsible for leading and growing the Faith-in-Action Champion team by engaging existing and new faith and community partners with the goal of bringing in at least \$250,000 in donations per year in home sponsorships, including an annual partnership with Thrivent Financial, Habitat's largest sponsor worldwide.

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Develop strategies to build and maintain faith community partnerships, including the maintenance of all current partnerships and building new relationships with diverse faith congregations to support Habitat home building and other program services.
- Monitor and follow up with faith partners on their fundraising progress.
- Develop relationships with clergy, denominational leadership, and volunteer faith committees to expand the capacity of the Faith-in-Action program.
- Work with the development and communications departments to create and maintain marketing materials and partnership tools to support faith partnerships.
- Plan, coordinate, and represent Habitat at annual faith-based events and build days.
- Create and maintain a detailed record of local faith partners as well as prospective faith partners.
- Coordinate scheduling and work closely with Volunteer Manager to ensure faith partners
 are informed about volunteer opportunities and enjoy their on-site experience at the build
 site and ReStore.
- Grow faith engagement with the ReStore by leading group volunteer projects there on a regular basis so that faith partners are as excited about the ReStore as they are about the build site and support the ReStore as a major fundraising arm of Habitat's mission.
- Travel frequently within service area to visit faith partners and prospective faith partners. This includes attending evening meetings and weekend worship services.
- Meet annual performance goals.
- Monitor and follow up with faith partners on their fundraising progress.
