Every year, the team at Fort Collins Habitat is amazed by the community support that makes our mission possible. From framing walls on the build site to hanging rugs at our ReStore and supporting operations as a committee member, volunteers have done amazing things this past year. You'll get to read more in this report, but here are some highlights from 2023:

- More volunteers served (compared to 2022), and, on average, rated their experience a
 4.7 out of 5
- Our organization became a certified Service Enterprise, meeting national standards for best practices in volunteer engagement.
- Youth engagement increased with our faith community's youth groups hosting lemonade stands and bake sales at the ReStore throughout the summer.

Events & Committees

- Books for Humanity (pictured to the right), led by volunteer Deanna Ludwin, returned for the first time since 2019. This program is open to homeowners and includes access to books and a bookshelf made by local volunteers.
- Our events committee and day-of event volunteers helped us raise almost \$175,000 at our 30th anniversary Homecoming Gala. We had so much fun, we're bringing it back in 2024!
- After our homeowner application period closed, 15 members of the qualification committee evaluated and interviewed applicants and then helped notify our newest group of homebuyers.
- Habitat Ambassadors represented Habitat at community events, sharing our mission and opportunities for involvement.
- The Hard Hats steering committee supported and coordinated partners in the construction industry to raise funds and sponsor a Habitat home.

Faith Champions

Faith Champions represent different churches and faith organizations in Fort Collins. They support Fort Collins Habitat by coordinating volunteer opportunities, promoting involvement with Habitat, and raising funds for the Faith Build through a variety of events. Last year, we had a lot of creative partnerships, including:

- Youth group led lemonade stands and bake sales held at the ReStore throughout the summer.
- Sue (Heart of the Rockies Church) supports planning and advocacy around our upcoming Heartside Hill development. She also organized a special 30th anniversary congregation-wide volunteer day that had volunteers serving across the organization.
- Jerry (Our Saviour's Lutheran Church/FOCOLU)
 coordinated a Christmas ornament fundraiser, bringing
 over 30 volunteers together to create Christmas
 ornaments or gifts. Over 250 items were made and
 the event raised \$3,800 to support the Faith Build.
- Dan (Foothills Unitarian Church) led a fun and impactful project with their church's youth, teaching middle and high school students how to safely use tools. The group then put their skills to the test by building a dog house and planter boxes that were sold at the ReStore.




Future Homebuyers
