General Description:

The Homeowner Services Coordinator is responsible for ensuring a successful transition to homeownership for Habitat for Humanity homebuyers. With the assistance of volunteer committees, the Homeowner Services Department leads key aspects of the homeownership program, including homebuyer outreach and qualification, homebuyer education, mortgage origination and servicing, and homeowner support. This is done in compliance with federal lending laws and regulations related to mortgage lending.

The Homeowner Services Coordinator will be the face of the community for those interested in learning about homeownership opportunities through Habitat. They will lead outreach to ensure enough buyers apply and are qualified. They should be welcoming, thoughtful and comfortable working with people from all walks of life. In addition, they will develop a pathway for applicants when they do not qualify – empowering them to take the steps needed to reach this goal. They will also facilitate homebuyer education, and support mentoring and service to Habitat homeowners and all departmental roles including mortgage lending and compliance.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Homebuyer Qualification:

- Work with Communications Director and Homebuyer Qualification Committee to create and execute an annual communications and marketing plan to reach potential buyers
- Affirmatively market the program to all, including groups that have historically faced discrimination or underrepresentation
- Conduct virtual and in-person informational community meetings to discuss homeownership program and qualification process monthly, including language accessibility
- Meet with interested applicants individually to discuss circumstances impacting their qualification

- Support homebuyer application process, which involves qualifying homebuyers based on their need, ability to pay, and willingness to work in partnership with Habitat
- Ensure enough qualified buyers are in the pipeline to meet construction schedule
- Serve as a member of the Homebuyer Qualification Committee
- Provide excellent customer service by conducting informal credit counseling sessions and referrals for applicants with the goal of creating individual road maps to qualify
- Strategically recruit and train new Homebuyer Qualification Committee members on an asneeded basis

Homebuyer Education, Communication and Policies:

- Execute and facilitate the homebuyer education curriculum, which aims to empower Habitat buyers so they can care for themselves and their homes independently and responsibly through the design and teaching of homebuyer education classes.
- Research and utilize existing community resources to enhance current curriculum.
- Assist homebuyers in completing HUD certified homeowner readiness course.
- Serve as support for homebuyers related questions.
- Assist in facilitating the closing process which may include education about obtaining insurance, transferring utilities, etc.
- Work with Homeowner Services Director to maintain department policies.

Facilitate Homebuyer Participation in Events and Media Interviews:

- Coordinate homebuyer events such as ground breakings, dedications, media interviews, etc. collaborating with staff event leads.
- Work with homebuyers to gather their testimonials.
- Assist homebuyers with speaking engagements.
- Coordinate interpretation of events if needed.

Mortgage Closings:

The Homebuyer Services Coordinator provides support for the Homeowner Services Director in mortgage lending and must complete and maintain courses to be a certified Qualified Loan Originator (QLO). The activities will vary depending on the candidate's experience level and MAY include:

- Participate in the process to ensure homebuyers continue to qualify for the home loan
- Assist in the creation of the elements of sale for homebuyers.
- Explain loan details and monthly payment to homebuyers by providing documentation and explanation in preparation for closing.
- Provide oversight of and serve as the contact person for loan servicing company.

- Field homebuyer questions related to their loans and the servicing of the loan including loans held by other parties.
- Support closing process including the following:
 - Working with homebuyers, title company and real estate broker
 - Collecting documentation for loan underwriting
 - Work with third party underwriter to underwrite the loan
 - Assist in document preparation
 - Schedule and facilitate meetings with real estate broker buyers to review documents
 - Work with title company on title work and coordination of the closing

Grants, Loan Sales, and Reporting:

- Assist Homeowner Services Director in facilitating post-grant submissions for government funding working with the Accounting & Finance Dept
- Assist Homeowner Services Director in preparing and packaging mortgages to sell and swap them as needed
- Gather data for quarterly reports and submit reports to Habitat International

Post-Closing Liaison:

- Serve as primary contact for homeowners after they have closed on their home.
- Serve as liaison between construction team and homeowners to ensure warranty items are addressed.
- Serve on the HOA board and recruit homeowners to serve as needed.
- Communicate with homeowners going through major life events that may impact their home ownership.
- Serve as liaison between homeowners and contract real estate broker and attorney to coordinate paperwork for repurchase or refinance of home.

Required Competencies:

- Mortgage lending experience or translatable experience and willingness to learn
- Planner- Willingness to use learned experience as well as research to develop methods for how homebuyers are served
- Networker- Establish and maintain relationships with other agencies and organizations in community to meet community needs and ensure services are not duplicated
- Motivated- Motivated to work and do research independently and potentially remotely

- Active Listener with Ability to Ask Deep Questions- Give full attention to what other
 people are saying, taking time to understand the points being made, asking questions as
 appropriate.
- Person- centered- Listens to people and meets them where they are.
- Connector- Provide information or refer individuals to public or private agencies or community services for assistance.
- Proactive Problem Solver- Actively looking for ways to help people. Using logic and reasoning to identify the strengths and weaknesses of alternative solutions, conclusions or approaches to problems.
- Skilled Listener and Observer- Being aware of others' reactions and understanding why they react as they do.
- Learner- Willing to learn new technology to work remotely.
- Great Oral Communicator- Talking to others to convey information effectively.

Preferred Competencies:

- Bilingual (Spanish and English) Advanced English speaker with intermediate English reading and writing skills
- Basic computer skills, MS Office, email, basic excel spreadsheets
- Ability to compose professional email in English and Spanish
- Ability to attend after-hours or off-site meetings as needed on an occasional basis
